Saginaw Township proudly announce safe shopping season!

The Saginaw Township Police Department is proud to announce that this past holiday season has absent of any serious crimes along the Bay Road retail corridor.

“Typically, the holiday season brings out criminals, as much as shoppers, from throughout Mid-Michigan” said Chief Donald Pussehl. Crimes such as larceny from vehicles, burglaries, assaults, and purse snatchings, often rise during this time of year.

During the month of December, and through the first week of January, no serious crimes were reported within the retail shopping district.

This reduction of incidents can be attributed to an increased patrol effort by the Saginaw Township Police Department, particularly the members of the Crime Prevention

Unit.

Crime Prevention Officers, along with the Saginaw County Sheriff Department and Michigan State Police, conducted an extremely successful “Shoplifting Blitz” that resulted in the arrest of 27 suspects for retail fraud and other various crimes, primarily in the Bay Road corridor.

The availability of local surveillance technology assisted the department with the use of two mobile camera systems.

* A four camera system, on loan from the Saginaw County Sheriff Department, was mounted on the Fashion Square Mall sign along Tittabawassee Road. This camera has a bright blue flashing light attached to announce its presence in hopes of deterring and preventing potential crime.

* Teachout Security Solutions provided a pole camera that was located in the Citizens Bank lot within the Fashion Square Mall.

Both cameras could be monitored by officers within their patrol cars, adding an additional set of eyes to reduce crime.

These initiatives, combined with the partnership between law enforcement and private security, help to ensure a safe and prosperous holiday shopping season for the Bay Road corridor, absent of any serious criminal incidents.
